Division 1 Trumpet Daffodils

One flower per stem, trumpet/corona as long or longer than perianth/petals

Class

1. Trumpet Daffodil, yellow – 1 stem in a vase
2. Trumpet Daffodils, yellow – 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety
3. Trumpet Daffodil, any colour other than yellow – 1 stem in a vase
4. Trumpet Daffodils, any colour other than yellow – 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety
5. Trumpet Daffodil, bicolour – 1 stem in a vase
6. Trumpet Daffodils, bicolour – 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety

Division 2 Large Cupped Daffodils

One flower per stem, cup more than one-third of but less than equal to length of perianth/petals

7. 1 stem in a vase
8. 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety

Division 4 Double Daffodils

One or more flowers per stem with doubling of Corona or Perianth or both

9. 1 stem in a vase
10. 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety

Division 9 Pheasant's Eye Narcissus

11. 1 stem in a vase
12. 3 stems in a vase

Divisions 5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 11, 12 and Miniatures

13. 1 stem in a vase
14. 3 stems in a vase, 1 or more varieties

Division 'any'. Mixed Daffodils/Narcissi

15. 12 stems of mixed daffodils/narcissi in a vase
To be judged on arrangement and selection of blooms

SECTION B FLOWERS – GENERAL

Classes 29-32 can be indoor or outdoor exhibits

16. Tulip – 1 stem in a vase
17. Tulips – 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety
18. Tulips – 5 stems in a vase, 1 or more varieties
19. Hyacinths – 3 cut stems in a vase
20. 12 cut stems of small or miniature bulbous plants in a vase
A minimum of 3 different varieties
21. 12 stems of spring flowers in a vase excluding bulbous plants and shrubs
A minimum of 3 different varieties
22. Polyanthus/Primula – 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety
23. Wallflowers – 3 stems in a vase
24. Pansies/Violas – 3 stems in a vase, 1 variety
25. Camellia – 1 flowering stem in a vase
26. Flowering shrubs/trees – 5 stems in a vase, 1 or more varieties
27. Flowering shrub/tree – 1 stem in a vase excluding camellias
28. Foliage – 3 stems in a vase
29. Flowering plant (excluding shrubs) in a pot up to 13 cm
30. Flowering plant (excluding shrubs) in a pot over 13 cm
31. Foliage plant in a pot up to 13 cm
32. Foliage plant in a pot over 13 cm
