SECTION A – FLOWERS

1. Dahlia – 1 decorative-type bloom
2. Dahlias – 3 cactus-type blooms, same size, one variety
3. Dahlias – 3 pompon-type blooms, same size, one variety, max size 50mm dia
4. Dahlias – two vases, 3 blooms in each, one or more varieties
5. Dahlias – 3 single-type blooms, same size, one variety
6. Fuchsia – 1 bloom, any variety
7. Fuchsia – in a pot up to 30cm diameter
8. Hydrangea – 3 stems, one or more varieties
9. Chrysanthemum – 5 stems, one or more varieties
10. Annuals – 9 stems, three or more varieties, in a vase
11. Hardy perennials – 5 stems, one or more varieties
12. Flowering shrub or shrubs – 5 stems, one or more varieties (*roses & hydrangeas excluded*)
13. Gladiolus – 1 spike, any variety
14. Flowering pot plant – pot over 13cm and not exceeding 30cm dia (*begonias, cacti, succulents and fuchsias excluded*)
15. Foliage plant – in a pot 13cm or less dia (*cacti, succulents and fuchsias excluded*)
16. Foliage plant – in a pot over 13cm and not exceeding 30cm dia (*cacti, succulents and fuchsias excluded*)
17. Succulent – in a pot up to 30cm dia (*1 plant only*)
18. Cacti – in a pot up to 30cm dia (*1 plant only*)
19. Flowering begonia – in a pot up to 30cm dia

SECTION B – ROSES

20. Rose, hybrid tea – 1 bloom, any variety
21. Rose – 1 bloom, any variety, for fragrance
22. Rose, floribunda – 1 stem, any variety
23. Rose, shrub – 1 stem, any variety
24. Roses – 5 stems in a vase, one or more varieties, any colour or colours

SECTION C – FRUIT (*exhibits to be shown with stalks*)

25. Collection of 8 apples – two varieties, 4 of each
26. Apples, dessert – 3, one variety
27. Apples, cooking – 3, one variety
28. Plums – 5, one variety
29. Raspberries – 10, one variety
30. Blackberries – 10, one variety (*hedgerow varieties acceptable*)
31. Selection of 5 different fruits on a plate (*fruits grown as bunches or strings to be exhibited as such*)

SECTION D – VEGETABLES

32. Beans, runner – 5, one variety
33. Beans, French – 5, one variety
34. Cucumber – 1, any variety
35. Marrow – 1, table quality, any variety, 35cm maximum length
36. Tomatoes – dish of 5, one variety, approx 6.5cm dia
37. Tomatoes – dish of 10, cherry type, one variety, max 3.5cm dia
38. Sweet peppers – 3, one or more varieties
39. Chillies – 5, one or more varieties
40. Carrots – 3, one variety with tops trimmed to approx 75mm
41. Beetroot – 3, one variety, each with tops trimmed and tied
42. Onions, harvested – 3, one variety under 250g each with tops trimmed and tied
43. Onions, harvested – 3, one variety over 250g each with tops trimmed and tied
44. Shallots, culinary – 10, one variety
45. Shallots, pickling – 10 under 3cm dia, one variety
46. Potatoes, white – 5, one variety
47. Potatoes, coloured – 5, one variety
48. Courgettes – one pair, same variety, 20cm maximum length
49. Squash – 1, any variety
50. Corn on the cob – one pair, same variety
51. Mixed herbs – 1 vase, minimum three different kinds
